He received certification in Christian Education, Bible and Theology from Rosedale Bible College, a bachelor's degree in English Education from Lincoln University, a Masters in American Literature and concentration in Linguistics from Bowling Green State University in Ohio where he also received a PhD in Ethnic American Literature. His first professorship was at Arkansas State University where he taught at both the undergraduate and graduate levels— Ethnic American Literature and Linguistics and History of English. Accepting a research fellowship, he taught at Kalamazoo College diversifying the curriculum.
